YOUR TIP PASS EXPLAINED

DON'T DUMP - DONATE!

Subsidised tip passes are issued to all rateable properties within the Shire. Three nine-token tip passes are issued for each rateable rural property, and one nine-token tip pass is issued for each rateable property within the kerbside rubbish collection areas.

Additional pre-paid refuse disposal vouchers can be purchased from the Shire Administration Office, or payments can now be made via Eftpos at the O'Neill Road Waste Management Facility.

One token equals up to 1 x 240L mobile garbage bin or the equivalent. When you present to the transfer station with your sorted waste, the attendant will assess what waste categories you have and 'clip' a token in accordance with the fees and charges. Attendants will also assess items suitable for the tip shop and assist with recycling.

If you sell your property, the tip pass must be provided to the new owner upon settlement. If your property is leased, please transfer the tip pass to your tenants. All replacement tip passes will incur the cost outlined in the 2025-26 Fees and Charges available on the Shire's website at:

WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?

Remember: lids off, rinsed and loose!



CARDBOARD & PAPER

Cardboard boxes,newspapers, magazines, envelopes, brochures, catalogues, phone books, milk and juice cartons

Waxed cardboard boxes



Car and truck batteries, accepted at all transfer stations



_ GLASS

Clean bottles and jars (green, brown and clear)

Broken drinking glasses, window glass or crockery

ALUMINIUM-

Cans and clean foil trays



PLASTICS

Clean milk bottles, soft drink bottles, cordial bottles, detergent bottles, juice bottles, ice cream, margarine, takeaway and yogurt containers

Plastic bags or polystyrene. Don't put your recyclables in bags, and remove lids as well

drumMUSTER

Triple rinsed, empty chemical drums (both plastic and steel) are accepted

There must be no trace of chemical residue



E-waste: anything with a plug, cord or battery cannot be disposed of in kerbside collections.
E-waste is accepted at Kendenup Transfer Station and O'Neill Road Waste Management Facility.

SCRAP METAL

Carbodies, iron, steel, wire, whitegoods



TIMBER

Posts, doors, frames.

Arsenic-treated treated pine and painted timbers



GREEN WASTE

This includes your lawn clippings, branches, garden prunings

Please don't contaminate your green waste with plastic, metal or concrete. Green waste also makes great compost!

STEEL

Empty and rinsed steel cans are accepted



CONCRETE, BRICKS AND RUBBLE

Clean concrete and bricksand rubble can be disposed of

anything that may have asbestos is prohibited at transfer stations

WASTEOIL

Clean used or unwanted motor oil can be disposed of into the collection tanks at O'Neill Road Waste Management Facility and Kendenup Transfer Station.

SORT & COVER YOUR LOAD

THE RIGHT WAY TO LOAD



Keep the same materials together. Neat piles of green waste, timber, bricks and scrap metal at the front and any leftover rubbish at the rear of your load will ensure you can move from bay to bay and recycle your load first then drop off your rubbish last. Securing your load with a net or tie down straps or ropes is essential.



If you throw everything into your trailer or ute together, it will be harder to separate your recyclable items from your rubbish. You will be tempted to simply throw everything into landfill.

SECURE YOUR LOAD



Unsecured loads pose a serious risk and is an offense under the Road Safety Act (1986). You can be fined for littering if rubbish from your load is blown onto the road or roadside area. Large unsecured items may cause a serious accident if they fall onto the road. Always secure your load.
