DOG ACT INFORMATION

REGISTRATION:

- Every dog over the age of three (3) months **MUST** be registered and microchipped.
- **No more than two (2) dogs over the age of three (3) months and the young of those dogs under that age may be kept on the premises if such premises are situated within a town site, at any one time unless the premise is a licensed kennel.**
- **No more than four (4) dogs over the age of three (3) months and the young of those dogs under that age may be kept on the premises, if such premises are situated outside a town site, at any one time unless the premises are a licensed kennel.**
- Registration can be effected at the Shire Administration Centre between 9.00am and 4.15pm Monday to Friday.
- Registration is valid anywhere in Western Australia.
- Failure to register and microchip dogs may lead to prosecution.
- No dog should **at any time** be outside the confines of its owner's property unless held on a leash.
- If the premises at which a dog will ordinarily be kept are not considered capable of effectively confining a dog within those premises, the Shire can refuse to register a dog.
- The owner then must either upgrade the fence/s to the required standard or remove the dog from the premises.

IMPOUNDED DOGS:

- All dogs are kept a minimum of 72 hours before disposal.
- Owners of registered dogs are contacted when the dog is picked up if the dog has an identification tag.
- Unregistered dogs will not be released from the pound until the dog has been registered and microchipped (if not already microchipped).
- Owners of impounded dogs may be required to pay a poundage fee, feeding and a penalty for the appropriate offence.

DOGS IN PUBLIC PLACES:

- All dogs allowed in public places must be held on a leash, however there are areas where dogs are permitted for exercising and details of these areas may be obtained from the Shire Administration Centre.

DOGS CAUSING A NUISANCE:

- Dog owners may be prosecuted if a dog creates a nuisance either by barking or straying onto other people's property. A Council Ranger will investigate all reports of dogs creating a nuisance.
