Mount Barker Public Library offers a broad range of fiction, non-fiction, large print, junior fiction and current popular stock. You can also borrow DVDs, audio books and reference books.

Library membership also provides access to a host of eResources with more than a million items available, including eBooks, eAudiobooks, movies and educational programs.

The Library is also a member of the Southern Western Australia Library Consortium, a group of 14 regional libraries. This gives members access to the catalogues of all the consortium members to borrow or reserve items, all delivered to your local Library. Your Mount Barker Library Membership Card will also work



Membership Information

Membership is **FREE**.

All loans are **free** and available for a **four week loan period**

Members can borrow up to 20 books and 10 DVDs at one time

Items may be renewed up to three times, giving you 12 weeks access to the resource (provided there are no reserves)

Weekly overdue charges no longer apply

There is no charge for access to the wide range of **eResources**

WIFI access is free

There is a range of **public computers** available for research, study or personal uses. Bookings are not required, however fees apply for computer use.

Other Library services include: printing, photocopying, scanning, laminating and IT assistance.
