6 BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

5.1 FIRE APPLIANCE HOSE FITTINGS AND DELUGE SYSTEM FILTER SEAL – ITEM 5.3 BFAC MEETING 1 MAY 2019

Background

The CBFCO advised that these systems were serviced annually.

Discussion took place about tank fittings and the inability of water tankers to connect to the water tanks on Braidwood Hill.

The EMWS advised this was an operational matter and would be attended to by the new CESM.

<u>Update</u>

A number of options were suggested but are not limited to the following:

- a) Have a variety of fittings on a wire at each tank;
- b) Fit out all of the bush fire appliances with adaptor fittings;
- Department of Biodiversity Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) already have 50mm (two inch) cam-lock bush fire fittings so change the tanks to these;
- d) Change to 75mm (three inch) cam-locks on <u>all tanks</u> and fit all trucks with 50mm (two inch) to 75mm (three inch) adaptors; and
- e) Encase 50mm (two inch) and 75mm (three inch) adaptors into a heavy concrete block and permanently fix the block to the tanks.

<u>Action</u>

Mr Mike Barnes to investigate the best possible solution for workability and cost effectiveness on ALL strategically placed water tanks and/or fire appliances by the next meeting.

5.2 TRUCKS' FOAM SYSTEM NOT WORKING – ITEM 5.5 BFAC MEETING 1 MAY 2019

Background

Members present discussed the difficulties they have with the foam system in fire trucks. It was suggested that Mr Wes Bailye (DFES) could look into the problem and advise if there are any alternative systems for foam input.

<u>Action</u>

Mr Wes Bailye – to update the committee of the alternative systems for foam input at the next meeting.

<u>Update</u>

The Committee discussed the issues that were occurring. Mr N Handasyde CBFCO advised that a contractor has serviced the appliances. The Y filters have been replaced which need to be cleaned separately from the flushing of the system. He also advised that he had spoken with the Regional Operational Advisory Committee (ROAC) and the Albany CBFCO and had been informed that some of their appliances were having the same issue.

Ron Caudwell reported that the Porongurup Appliance has been having the same issue and the brigade looked into purchasing stainless steel ones at a cost of \$68.00. It would be cheaper just to replace the existing Y filters periodically.

Further Action

Mr Mike Barnes to follow up the issue of the foam system in fire trucks with Mr Bailye and the service mechanic, then report back to the next Committee Meeting.

7 GENERAL BUSINESS

7.1 LOCAL GOVERNMENT GRANT SCHEME (LGGS)

Mr Barnes discussed the LGGS and highlighted the difference between the Operational Grant and the Capital Grant that is administered by DFES.

- a) The Operating Grant is for the day to day running of brigades which covers;
 - Purchase of plant and equipment (less than \$1,500 per item);
 - Maintenance of plant and equipment;
 - Maintenance of vehicles, trailers and boats;
 - Maintenance of land and buildings;
 - Clothing and Accessories;
 - Utilities, rates and taxes;
 - Other goods and services;
 - Insurances; and
 - Purchase of plant and equipment (from \$1,500.00 to \$5,000.00 per item).
- b) The Capital Grant, which covers but is not limited to;
 - The acquisition of vehicles;
 - The acquisition of Bush Fire Sheds; and
 - The acquisition of strategically placed water tanks.

7.2 REGIONAL OPERATIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE - REGIONAL RESOURCE TO RISK

Introduction

Each year local governments are able to submit Resource to Risk (R2R) applications for a <u>Capital Grant</u> consideration from DFES. These grants relate to significant capital works initiatives, including the acquisition of facilities, appliances, vehicles and major items of equipment.

This proposal is **<u>not</u>** related to the operational grant each local government (LG) receives to manage the day to day running of brigades.

Background

There are limited applications that are successful and each LG is competing for the allocation of funds for these capital grants.

At a recent Great Southern ROAC meeting, a recommendation was made in support of a need for change in the R2R process to have a collaborative and more strategic approach in how the region prioritises these applications.

It was agreed that ROAC is an appropriate working group to prioritise the collective submissions from each LG and submit a more strategic group of R2R applications that have been endorsed by all CCFCOs of this committee in consultation with LGs.

Discussion Points

- If agreed by LGs a model or concept plan would be initiated by a working group. This concept would not likely to start until 2021.
- If agreed, there will need to be a shift in timings of applications to allow for alignment of ROAC meetings and BFAC meetings.
- One option is that each LG wishing to apply for the R2R grant should submit a short (150-300) overview of the proposed application for consideration by CBFCOs before a ROAC meeting.
- At the meeting each LG CBFCO presents to the committee on their application to give members the opportunity to discuss each application.
- The CBFCOs would rank the submissions into priority order for the region and vote to accept these nominations.
- It would then be up to those who had submitted the highest priority applications to provide a more comprehensive document to be signed off with support from all contributing LGs.

OFFICER RECOMMENDATION

That it be a recommendation to the Council:

That the Plantagenet Bush Fire Advisory Committee vote to accept a more collaborative approach to the Resource to Risk applications from local governments within the Great Southern Regional Operational Advisory Committee.
