PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to recommend some amendments to the Heavy Plant Replacement Program for 2018/19.

BACKGROUND

The Council at its meeting held on 10 July 2018 resolved to accept the Shire budget for 2018/19. This included the allowance for heavy plant replacement for \$936,234.00 with \$226,909.00 allocated to trade-ins.

Minor Plant replacement was allocated \$208,250.00 with \$72,500.00 for tradeins. The Plant Replacement Program can be summarised in the table below. Please note all figures exclude GST.

To date all purchases except for one light vehicle (Works Crew Transporter) have been at or below budget with savings made in a number of areas.

Minor Plant Savings

The heavy duty slasher was replaced with a new genuine Bobcat slasher at a saving of \$25,400.00. This slasher has proved to be exceptionally capable for its assigned tasks and is well regarded by staff for its ease of hook-up and operating parameters. It has features such as a floating deck which reduces impact when cutting across uneven ground resulting in a much smoother cut, as does its twin rotor design which increases torque distribution at the cutting point (outside edge of blades) compared to traditional single bar slashers. This increase results in constant rotation speed and a smooth cut. The blades are very easy to change as the whole slasher is able to be tilted sideways hydraulically so the deck is near vertical, and maintenance is able to be carried out more easily (and therefore frequently) in a safer manner.

The old slasher was not able to be traded in due to its poor condition but has been minimally refurbished for use in 'rough' cutting areas behind the Kubota tractor.

Two lawnmowers were due to be changed over this year but with the decision to make one member of the Parks and Gardens team redundant and to put approximately half of the mowing out to contract, a single mower was purchased in their place. This mower is considerably more robust and powerful than the trade-in mowers with a slightly wider cut. It has also proved its worth and has anecdotally cut mowing times down to nearly half in the portions mowed by Shire staff.

Heavy Plant Replacement

At previous meetings the issue of grader replacement (G3) was discussed. Costings of various replacement options are shown at Attachment One. As of the date of the Agenda closing the Manager Works and Services (MWS) is still awaiting a changeover costing and analysis of the Shire's grader from Westrac.

Prices have been received from Komatsu and John Deere for new graders and are shown below.

Komatsu GD555_5 Motor Grader - \$335,000.00 (ex GST)

John Deere 670GP Motor Grader - \$381,900.00 (ex GST) - trade-in \$105,000.00

The full service history of G3 is attached to enable Committee Members to make informed decisions on various options (see Attachment Two)

The disposal or not of G3 also ties in with a proposal to replace the existing water truck. The Shire's current water truck continues to experience mechanical issues and is currently in the workshop again awaiting new parts. A service history of the water truck and the two trucks currently budgeted for replacement (T3 and T31) are shown at Attachment Three. In addition, an email from a local heavy vehicle supplier is included where various options and prices are discussed.

Some of the options for the replacement of the Shire's water truck are:

- 1. Continue to fix it, noting that it is a rare US built truck and that parts are very hard to locate in Australia. The replacement axle had to be obtained from the USA earlier this year at a cost of \$3,878.00 for the part;
- Outright purchase another 6 wheeler using savings from retaining the grader, keeping T31 (Isuzu GIGA) as a third 6 wheeler and purchasing a slip-in water tank (13,000 to 15,000L); or
- 3. Similar to Option 2 above but outright purchase another similar sized light truck (6 wheeler), retain the smaller truck T3 (8 tonne) and use the existing fibreglass tank which is able to legally carry 9,000L.

Each option has pro's and con's but the least favoured is Option 1 because of the unreliability of the vehicle.

Options 2 and 3 would benefit work efficiency overall with the most efficient being Option 2. However, with efficiency comes cost when outright purchase values are taken into account.

Hiring a water truck was not considered in any detail as it would likely cost in the order of \$60,000.00 or more annually.

Purchasing a new, purpose built water truck is seen as being too expensive. A copy of a costing received gives some information on the magnitude of such a purchase (Attachment Four).
