



Location Plan



LOCATION PLAN







AMENDMENT REPORT

Lot 151 Muir Highway and Langton Road is occupied by the Council depot. Muir Highway divides the lot into two portions. The majority of the infrastructure (buildings and equipment) is located in the south eastern portion of the lot. The north western portion of the lot is used as a storage area for the bulk commodities such as gravel, sand, blue metal, timber and bricks.

Two new vehicular entries to the site were provided as part of the construction of the new portion of Muir Highway. There is an entry and exit to the south eastern portion of the lot from Langton Road.

Lot 151 Muir Highway is zoned Special Industrial in the Shire of Plantagenet Town Planning Scheme No. 3. This Special Industrial zoning category was introduced many years ago and was created primarily for the yet to be developed Yerriminup special industrial area located south of Mount Barker on Albany Highway. The former abattoir site located at the junction of McDonald Avenue and Taylor Road is also zoned Special Industrial.

The Special Industrial zoning category was created with the intent of catering for the larger industries that have the potential to require extensive buffer requirements and land use controls such as pulp mills, tanneries, abattoirs and so on.

The Council has no intention of using any of the present depot site for the kinds of industries envisaged in the Special Industrial zone hence this proposed Amendment to Town Planning Scheme No. 3 will change the zoning to Industrial. The Industrial zone is considered a far more appropriate zoning for this Lot 151 Muir Highway.

The Council's Planning Vision, Town Planning Scheme Policy No. 18 and the draft Local Planning Strategy, show Lot 151 Muir Highway as its existing Special Industrial zone. Both of those documents also show the adjoining Lot 152 Muir Highway to the north and east as being rezoned from Rural to Industrial. When the owner of Lot 152 wishes to have that property rezoned to Industrial will be a decision that owner makes. In the interim the Council wishes to rezone its Lot 151 Muir Highway from Special Industrial to Industrial.

The second part of this Amendment involves 4.87ha of vacant Crown land with no lot number, but with the Crown property identifier of PIN 622543. This land is located south of Bourke Street and east of Taylor Road and is zoned Industrial under Town Planning Scheme No. 3. The land is well vegetated.

In work carried out by consultants for LandCorp in December 2008, an Environmental Opportunities and Constraints Assessment found there were areas of P3 and P4 priority flora specis present. The Assessment did state these particular species may be well represented in bushland to the south of Langton Road but more work would be needed to determine this. The main obstacle with this land is that there were some 19 trees with recorded Black Cockatoo habitat. This bird is a threatened specis and the Federal

Department of Environment has very onerous requirements to be achieved before any areas with such habitat can be cleared. It is highly likely approval would never be obtained to clear this vegetated area to create Industrial lots.

This second part of this Amendment proposes this subject piece of vacant Crown land south of Bourke Street be rezoned from Industrial zone to Local Scheme Reserve for Recreation. This will protect the vegetation which contains P3 and P4 flora specis and the black cockatoo habitat trees.

As stated earlier, Lot 152 Muir Highway which is located to the north and east of the Council's Lot 151, is shown as being rezoned from Rural to Industrial in the Council's Planning Vision and draft Local Planning Strategy. The majority of Lot 152 Muir Highway has been cleared of vegetation. The owner of Lot 152 Muir Highway may at some stage in the future propose the land be rezoned to Industrial and subdivided for Industrial lots. The eventual rezoning of that Lot 152 Muir Highway would be preferable to trying to clear the vacant Crown land south of Bourke Street.







OBJECTIVE:

To provide clear guidelines to the Council, its officers and tree farm companies regarding log/woodchip haulage on roads within the Shire of Plantagenet.

POLICY:

- 1. The Council will provide letters of support for Main Roads WA permits for log/woodchip haulage on roads within the Shire of Plantagenet provided that the Manager Works and Services is satisfied with the proposed haulage route(s) and provided that the following conditions are adhered to by the tree farm companies:
 - a) All **H**-heavy **H** haulage permits being obtained from Main Roads WA;
 - b) Neighbouring properties to access routes being notified of the commencement date and anticipated duration, at least one (1) week prior to the commencement of harvest;
 - c) Speeds being limited to 60km/h on unsealed roads and 80km/h on sealed roads without pavement markings and 90km/h on sealed roads with pavement markings or 10km/h lower than the posted speed limit of roads under 80kms or whichever is the lesser;
 - d) Suitable sign posting for traffic as per in accordance with Australian Standard AS1742.3-2002, with signs identifying truck movements to be placed at the entrance and exit of the property according to standard;
 - e) All owner/operators adhering to any road closure as specified in Section 3.50 of the Local Government Act 1995 and refraining from driving heavy vehicles on roads affected by wet weather conditions;
 - f) Cartage through townsites being limited to **twelve** 12 hours daily between the hours of 6.00am and 6.00pm;
 - g) School bus operators being notified of the commencement date and the anticipated duration, at least one (1) week prior to the commencement of harvest;
 - h) All gravel roads covered under the letter of approval being graded, by the tree farm companies during haulage as required;
 - i) The Council being advised of any seal failures on bitumen roads within twenty four 24 hours so that repairs can be carried out;
 - j) Roads being reinstated to pre-haulage condition, by the tree farm companies, at the completion of harvest;
 - Post haulage inspections being carried out on roads covered in the letter of approval, as advised by the Manager Works and Services; and
 - 1) Cartage being ceased on Christmas Day and New Year's Day.
- 2. The Council reserves the right to revoke support if any of the above conditions are not adhered to, or road condition/user safety is in question.

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Background

The Shire of Plantagenet

The Shire of Plantagenet is located in the Great Southern region of Western Australia, 350km south of Perth. The Shire is bounded by the City of Albany and the Shires of Cranbrook, Gnowangerup, Denmark and Manjimup. The total Shire area is 4,792km².

The Shire incorporates five main population centres: Mount Barker, Rocky Gully, Kendenup, Porongurup and Narrikup.

With a population of more than 5,000, the Shire of Plantagenet has an array of industrial, agricultural and tourism riches, including broad-acre cropping, cattle, sheep and wool production, forestry (predominantly blue gums), viticulture and horticulture.

The Shire is becoming increasingly popular as a desired location for people seeking a 'tree change' and hobby farmers.

The Shire also incorporates nearly half of the Stirling Range National Park, the Porongurup Range National Park and a large portion of the Walpole Wilderness Area.

Functions, facilities and services provided by the Shire of Plantagenet

The Shire of Plantagenet is responsible for a range of functions, facilities and services, including:

Services to property:

- construction and maintenance of Shire owned buildings, roads, footpaths and trails:
- land drainage and development;
- · waste collection and disposal;
- litter control:
- planting and caring for street trees and gardens, and provision and maintenance of street furniture and public art;
- numbering of buildings and lots;
- street lighting; and
- bush fire control.

Services to the community:

- provision and maintenance of playing areas, parks, gardens, reserve, outdoor bbg areas and facilities for sporting and community groups;
- management of a recreation centre, swimming pool and public libraries;

- community safety and crime prevention planning;
- · preparation and testing of community emergency management plans; and
- advocacy on behalf of specific community groups, eg aged persons.

Regulatory services:

- planning of road systems, sub-divisions and town planning schemes;
- building approvals for construction, additions or alterations to buildings;
 and
- environmental health services and ranger services including dog control and parking control.

General administration:

- the provision of general information to the public, the lodging of complaints and paying of fees including rates and dog licences; and
- administration of Department of Transport payments.

Processes of government:

- ordinary and special Council and Committee meetings; and
- Public meetings, community consultation and election of Council Members.

People with disabilities in the Shire of Plantagenet

The number of people with disabilities in the Shire of Plantagenet is estimated to be 983, based on the statistics provided by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) Survey of Disability, Ageing and carers (2003)¹.

The Shire population is with many mature aged people including many retirees moving into the area. The ABS statistics highlight that around half of people aged over 60 identify themselves as having a disability, therefore the proportion of people with disabilities within the Shire may increase markedly over the next 5 to 10 years.

Planning for better access

The Western Australia Disability Services Act requires all Local Governments to develop and implement a Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP) to ensure that people with disabilities have equal access to its facilities and services.

Other legislation underpinning access and inclusion includes the Western Australia Equal Opportunity Act (1984) and the Commonwealth Disability Discrimination Act (1992), both of which make discrimination on the basis of a person's disability unlawful.

¹ Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) survey of Disability, Ageing and Carers (2003) estimates that 20.6% of Australians identify themselves as having some form of disability.

Progress since 2007

The Shire of Plantagenet is committed to facilitating the inclusion of people with disabilities through the improvement of access to its facilities and services. The Shire's DAIP provides guidance for the Council and the Shire of Plantagenet community to become accessible and inclusive to people with disabilities, their families and carers.

Several strategies from the DAIP have been implemented by the Shire including:

- Providing an audio-book catalogue and e-book service which can be accessed through the internet, either at home or free of charge at the Library, for Library patrons;
- Purchasing exercise equipment designed for people with limited abilities for the Recreation Centre gymnasium;
- Delivering the Heartmoves program from the Recreation Centre which comprises exercise movements for people with limited abilities; and
- Progressing the Nature Play playground design, including the installation of a tractor funded by the Disability Services Commission, which is designed to suit all young people regardless of impairments to mental or physical development.

Shire staff attended a training session to enhance their understanding of the legislative and social requirements for disability access and inclusion, prior to updating the Shire's DAIP.

Access and Inclusion Policy Statement

Policy Number: CS/LP/1

Adopted: 24 July 2007

OBJECTIVE

The Shire of Plantagenet is committed to ensuring that the community is an accessible and inclusive community for people with disabilities, their families and carers. An accessible and inclusive community is interpreted as one in which all council functions, facilities and services (both in-house and contracted) are open, available and accessible to people with disabilities, providing them with the same opportunities, rights and responsibilities as other people in the community.

POLICY

The Shire of Plantagenet will plan to achieve the following strategies to ensure the community is accessible and inclusive for people with disabilities, their families and carers:

- 1. People with disabilities have the same opportunities as other people to access the services of, and any events organised by, the Shire of Plantagenet;
- 2. People with disabilities have the same opportunities as other people to access the buildings and other facilities of the Shire of Plantagenet;
- The Shire of Plantagenet provides information in a format that will enable people with disabilities to access the information as readily as other people are able to access it;
- 4. People with disabilities receive the same level and quality of service from the staff of the Shire of Plantagenet as other people;
- 5. People with disabilities have the same opportunities as other people to make complaints to the Shire of Plantagenet; and
- 6. People with disabilities have the same opportunities as other people to participate in any public consultation arranged by the Shire of Plantagenet.

The Shire of Plantagenet is committed to consulting with people with disabilities, their families and carers and disability organisations in addressing barriers to access and inclusion.

Development of the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan

Responsibility for the planning process

The Manager of Community Services has responsibility to oversee the development, implementation, review and evaluation of the DAIP. The final plan is endorsed by the Council and it is the responsibility of a range of officers to implement the relevant actions.

Community consultation process

In 2012 the Shire drafted a new DAIP to guide further improvements to access and inclusion, based on Community Consultation outcomes and key stakeholders.

The process included:

- Examination of the existing DAIP to see what has been achieved and what still needs addressing;
- Examination of other Council documents and strategies;
- Consultation with staff from both the Shire of Plantagenet and relevant agencies;
- · Consultation with the Council; and
- · Consultation with the community.

The community was informed through the Plantagenet News (local newspaper) and the Council's website that the Council was reviewing its DAIP. Members of the community were given the opportunity to provide comment at a Morning Tea workshop or by providing information by telephone, written form or e-mail.

Findings of the consultation

Several community members, the Local Area Coordinator from the Disability Services Commission and Shire representatives workshopped the draft Disability Access and inclusion Plan and discussed several concerns and opportunities for improvement. The key areas identified as a problem were:

- Lack of facilities at the pool including a disabled parking bay and toilet / change area;
- Concerns about the practicality of some of the Disabled Parking Bays in town;

- Townsite footpaths, kerbing and on / off ramps;
- Shop front access along Lowood Road;
- Lack of pedestrian crossings across Lowood Road;
- Inappropriate parking in disabled parking bays; and
- The need for an Advisory Committee to help with planning facilities for people with a disability.

Responsibility for implementing the DAIP

It is a requirement of the Disability Services Act that public authorities must take all practical measures to ensure that its officers, employees, agents and contractors implement the DAIP.

Implementation of the DAIP is the responsibility of all areas of the Council. The Implementation Plan sets out who is responsible for each action.

Review and evaluation mechanisms

The Disability Services Act requires that DAIPs be reviewed at least every five years. Whenever the DAIP is amended, a copy of the amended plan must be lodged with the Disability Services Commission. The DAIP review will include an evaluation of activities that have occurred over the five years and will involve consultation with the community, staff, elected members and key agencies.

Reporting on the DAIP

The Manager of Community Services (employee with responsibility for the DAIP) will analyse progress of the DAIP Implementation Plan annually and provide a report to the Council on progress and recommended changes. A copy of the report must also be forwarded to the Disability Services Commission by July 31 annually.

The Disability Services Act also requires that the Shire reports on the implementation of the DAIP in the Annual Report, outlining:

- Progress towards the desired outcomes of its DAIP;
- Progress of its agents and contractors towards meeting the desired outcomes; and
- The strategies used to inform agents and contractors of its DAIP.

Promotion of the DAIP

The DAIP will be accessible from the Shire of Plantagenet internet site or e-mailed on request.

Promotion of the DAIP through local media outlets, for example the Plantagenet News, will occur following the endorsement of the DAIP by the Council.

Implementation Plan to improve access and inclusion

The following strategies have been developed to address each of the six desired outcome areas of the Disability Services Act and from feedback gained in the public consultation process:

Outcome 1: People with disabilities have the same opportunities as other people to access the services of, and any events organised by, the Shire of Plantagenet.






Fig 1 of 2 ~ Features Set-out
