KCMS Inc. is planning to construct a new 450 m2 purpose built community and men's shed and plant nursery on land allocated by the Plantagenet Shire adjacent to the Kendenup tennis courts. KCMS plans to fund the construction by applying for grants from LotteryWest, Bedigo Bank, CBH and through other appropriate funding sources.

Although concept plans have been prepared, KCMS Inc. needs to raise funds to cover architectural fees, and the services of a professional grant writer prior to submitting major grant funding applications.

At completion of construction of the new building at least 40 residents from Kendenup, Mt. Barker, Porongorups and surrounding areas.

#### What benefits will your project provide to the Plantagenet community?

As we age, mental health and wellbeing become increasingly important for both men and women. Nowhere is this more so than in small rural communities which lack the luxury of support services for those experiencing age related problems, or isolation, loneliness, and depression resulting from broken relationships, the loss of a partner or the lack of a sense of purpose after retirement or job loss. Suicide is an enormous problem in Australian society, with 3,214 Australians taking their own life in 2023. Males are three times more likely to die by suicide than females. Age-standardised rates of death by suicide are 50% higher in regional areas.

Community and men's sheds now hold an important place in Australian culture and have done much to alleviate this growing problem by reinstating a sense of self-worth by providing a place of refuge where men and women can create new friendships, work on personal or community projects, swap stories and share skills with each other. Community and Men's Sheds also provide a resource to learn how to cope with issues related to mental and physical health through the provision of health-related talks and lectures.

Social contacts and being useful are two of the major contributors to good health and well-being. The KCMS Inc. will address the afore listed

#### Explain how you know this project is needed and is supported by the community? (research?)

A public meeting called in September 2024 to float the concept of a community and men's shed for Kendenup was attended by 24 residents who were unanimous in their support for the proposal. Since 5th October when it was incorporated, the KMCS Inc. dedicated and strong core membership grew to 40 financial members with both genders being equally represented.

- Quantifiable Mental Health Benefits
- Social Connection: In a large-scale Australian study, 45% of participants said the greatest benefit of joining a Shed was "socialising or getting out", while 41% cited "making new friends".

   Reduced Isolation: Shed members reported significantly lower levels of loneliness compared to non-members, especially after retirement or major life changes like bereavement or relocation.

   Improved Self-Esteem: Participants described regaining a sense of purpose and confidence through learning new skills and contributing to community projects.
- Mental Health Engagement: The Shed model creates a relaxed, friendly space that encourages open discussion of health issues—especially for those reluctant to engage with formal mental health services.
  - Targeting At-Risk Groups: Around 45% of Shed members come from lower socio-economic areas, where mental health risks are higher. Sheds offer a culturally safe and accessible
- environment for these men.
- Why It Works
- Activities are hands-on and collaborative, which fosters camaraderie.
- The environment is informal and non-clinical, reducing stigma around mental health.
- Sheds often host health talks and workshops tailored to men's needs.
