5.1 SAFE SPEEDS

5.2 SAFE ROAD USE

5.2.1 WALGA ROADWISE TRAILER

WALGA have some funding to put towards maintenance of the WALGA RoadWise trailer currently located at the Shire Depot.

The proposal is to make the trailer roadworthy and use it as storage for Driver Revivers as well as other road safety events in the region.

Ms Gardiner advised she was still in the process of getting the trailer repaired. Mr Lynch advised he would also get in touch with the contractor.

5.2.2 DRIVER REVIVER

Cr Bell discussed the report presented at the Council Meeting of 22 November 2022. The report was adjourned to the December meeting so Cr Bell could get in contact with the Cranbrook RoadWise Committee. Cr Bell advised he had been in contact with the Works Manager at Cranbrook who confirmed the Shire was willing to continue assisting by loaning a VMB. Volunteers from both groups would be invited to help at each Shire's DR.

As discussed in the report presented to the Council, the Cranbrook committee are planning to run a DR in June. The site will be the truck stop on the corner of Albany and Great Southern Highways.

Plantagenet RoadWise Committee members confirmed their support for the continuation of the Plantagenet run DR. Discussion by the group about the program indicated that Tenterden was the preferred site. During the discussion, Ms Gardiner highlighted that the DR was set up to be a volunteer run programme.

The outcome of the report being presented to the Council at the meeting of 20 December would be discussed at the February 2023 RoadWise meeting.

5.3 SAFE ROADS AND ROADSIDES

5.3.1 ALBANY HIGHWAY ALL-INCLUSIVE CROSSING

Initially discussed at the RoadWise Meeting of 28 April, this request returned to the committee to consider options for an all-inclusive crossing on Albany Highway.

Mr Lynch discussed the layout of the current crossing near the Albany Highway intersection of Booth Street. He said that it met most of Main Roads specifications except for tactile pavers, which could be installed. He also suggested that yellow lines could be painted to help guide dogs navigate the crossing.

5.3.2 ALBANY HIGHWAY ROAD SURFACE – MOUNT BARKER TOWNSITE

Cr Bell highlighted the damaged condition of some sections of Albany Highway within the Mount Barker townsite.

Mr Lenton advised that Main Roads were aware of the damaged sections and that routine maintenance would address these.

5.3.3 LOWOOD ROAD – BICYCLE PATHWAYS

Cr Bell expressed his concern for the possible installation of cycle paths on Lowood Road as part of the 2022/23 road upgrade.

Both Mr Lenton and Mr Lynch advised the lane width was too narrow for cycle lanes and that the footpath on the west side of the road was the best option.

6 AGENCY REPORTS

6.1 ROADWISE

Ms Gardiner provided a report as shown at Attachment Two.

She highlighted the Road Safety Dates for 2023 at Attachment Three and advised the committee could focus on any of the options. Otherwise she would work with the Shire's Communications Officer to publicise the various events.

Ms Gardiner reminded committee members of the Road Safety Forum to be held in Cranbrook in March 2023.

6.2 MAIN ROADS WA

Mr Lenton reported on the increase of rubbish that is being dumped in rest bays. Recent examples include tyres and engine oil. He advised that Main Roads were looking at closing the smaller stops and making the larger stops more attractive to motorists. The pull-in bay on Albany Highway at Tunney was under consideration to be upgraded to a regional stop. This could mean that infrastructure like public toilets may be installed.

6.3 MOUNT BARKER POLICE

Sgt Byram reported on recent activity by local Police. A number of speeding fines had been issued in the last fortnight. He also reported on recent road accidents in the region which could be attributed to fatigue.

6.4 SHIRE OF PLANTAGENET

Mr Lynch advised that rubbish collected at Main Roads rest bays could be put at Shire of Plantagenet waste facilities.

6.5 MOUNT BARKER COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Mr Beck, representing the MBCC, advised the school was looking to reinstate Leavers Alive in 2023. This is an activity which simulates a road accident and demonstrates to students the response required from local first responders. It is aimed at older students who are looking to get their L plates.

6.6 COMMUNITY MEMBER

Mrs Drage did not have a report.

Road Traffic Safety Policy - Shire of Manjimup

The Shire of Manjimup has been participating in the WALGA RoadWise Demonstration Project to put in place a road safety management system, which will provide a systematic approach to managing road safety performance on the Shire's roads.

As a result of this project, the Shire has developed and adopted a *Road Traffic Safety Policy* to start embedding road safety across the organisation.

The measures set out in the Policy cover the following areas: roads and roadsides, intersections, reducing travel speeds, fleet safety and post-crash response. The Policy applies to all Shire managed roads, roadsides, footpaths and cycle paths. This policy also maps all of the Shire's policies and plans where road safety is relevant.

The Policy aims to ensure the Shire has a robust approach to road safety by embedding safe system methodology through the implementation of a Road Safety Management System across the Shire's organisational activities. The next steps involve developing an implementation plan to prioritise interventions and to update or review existing council policies and guidelines to reflect Safe System methodology.

To WALGA's knowledge, this is the first time this approach has been taken by a Local Government in Western Australia. A copy of the Policy can be found on the https://www.manjimup.wa.gov.au/our-documents/policies/technicalservices website.

Injury Matters - Six Supportive Steps Campaign

Injury Matters', Road Trauma Support WA recently launched the 'Six Supportive Steps' online campaign to support people affected by a road crash in the lead-up to the holiday season. The campaign aims to:

- make sure Western Australians know Road Trauma Support WA is here year-round with free, no-referral road trauma resources, support and counselling.

The six-week campaign commenced on World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims, Sunday, 20 November and will run through to the end of December. Each week the campaign will focus on one of six supportive steps: Remember, Acknowledge, Plan, Take Time, Support and Act.

Best Practice Road Safety - Guide for Road Safety Interventions

In 2021 the World Bank's Global Road Safety Facility (GRSF) developed the *Guide for Road Safety Interventions: Evidence of What Works and What Does Not Work.* It was developed to help road safety practitioners understand the most effective road safety treatments and why some that seem 'common sense' have very limited or even negative impacts.

The Guide presents evidence-based interventions which focuses on elements of safe road and roadside design for road networks that can provide safe mobility for all road users. In addition, the Guide highlights initiatives that are complementary such as changes to improve speeds, vehicle safety, road user behaviour and post-crash care. Importantly the Guide also identifies clear examples where interventions are not effective.
