

WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?



Rigid plastic bottles and containers

rinse first
(place small lids into waste bin)



Steel cans, aluminium tins and foil

clean and dry
(foil scrunched into ball)



Glass bottles and jars

rinse first
(place large lids separately)



Cardboard

(flatten cardboard to maximise space)



Clean paper

(no shredded paper)

Keep these out

Placing the wrong items in your kerbside bin could contaminate a whole truck load. Keep recycling free of contamination to prevent it ending up in landfill.

Useful Tips

for managing your kerbside bins



1

Timing

Put your bins at the kerbside the night before or by **5am** on the morning of collection.

RECYCLING



240lt recycle bin is collected fortnightly.

GENERAL WASTE



120lt household rubbish bin is collected weekly.

3

Not too close

Place bins away from overhanging trees, telephone poles or parked cars as these get in the way of the truck clearing your bins.

4

Don't overfill

The bin lid must be closed for collection. Extra items placed on top or next to the bin will not be collected.

5

Take care of your bin

It is the property owner's responsibility to buy and maintain their bins. Bins can be purchased in Albany from Plastics Plus or Cleanaway who also sell spare parts such as lids, wheels, axles and pins.

6

Numbering

Put your number on your bin, especially if you are in a block of units.

7

Transfer Stations

Extra waste, recycling and items not suitable to be placed in any bin can be taken to your local transfer station.
